



CD, WORKBOOK and ANSWER KEY

1	 Listen to the CD and read the story of Mirror and the Beast. Each part of the story begins on a new page, with a big letter. You may want to look up some new words in the dictionary.
2	 When you have finished reading Mirror and the Beast: Go back to the beginning. Read the discussion questions and think about your answers. You may want to read parts of the story again.
3	 Now try to do the exercises for WORD WIZARDS. Find the first highlighted word gradually on the first page of the story. Now look below at the first WORD WIZARD exercise. Which word/group of words means the same as gradually? Did you find it? Gradually MEANS little by little. Copy the word 'gradually' on line Number 6. See if you can do all the numbers from 2 to 8. The first one is done for you.
4	Now you are ready to draw and colour your first picture. You will need some drawing paper and crayons, colouring pencils or paints.
5	 Can you draw the Prince trying to make friends with the Water Sprite? Try to draw some of the things you have read about on the first page of the story. For example: In the Prince's garden, there is a rose tree and a fountain. The tiny Watersprite lives in a silver bubble at the bottom of the fountain. Every morning, tiny Old Man Sunsprite leaves a trail of sundrops on the lawn. What else should be in your drawing? You decide. You can colour all the other illustrations in your workbook too.
6	 When you have finished all the WORD WIZARD exercises and your drawings, there are even more activities to do at the back of your workbook. Read the instructions carefully, then do your best. When you want to check your answers, you will find them in the MIRROR AND THE BEAST ANSWER KEY on PAGE ONE at the end of this book. Now you are ready to write and illustrate your own story. Have fun!




